



TYPE OF KING Lesson 7

### The Commanding King

Jesus spoke as king when He said, "Why do you call Me, 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say?" (Luke 6:46). Some rightly call Jesus "Lord" but their behavior does not demonstrate their belief. More than a source of frustration, for Jesus this was all important: "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments" (John 14:15). The apostle John teaches the same principle saying, "The one who says, "I have come to know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him" (1 John 2:4). Many today want to dismiss Jesus as King by disregarding His commands, while at the same time calling Him "Lord" of their life. We must not deceive ourselves.

Jesus commands through the apostles. The writing of the apostles also refers to this truth. "For you know what commandments we gave you by the authority of the Lord Jesus" (1 Thess. 4:2). "That you should remember the words spoken beforehand by the holy prophets and the commandment of the Lord and Savior spoken by your apostles" (2 Peter 3:2). "If anyone thinks he is a prophet or spiritual, let him recognize that the things which I write to you are the Lord's commandment" (1 Cor. 14:37). ### **Submission To The King**
