- 8. What did God promise Israel? What condition did He place on this promise? (Ex. 23:20–33)?
- 9. What was the "book of the Covenant" (Ex. 24:1–7)? What did the people do upon hearing this book (Ex. 24:7–8)?
- 10. Who went part way up mount Sinai (Ex. 24:1, 9)? What did they see (Ex. 24:9–11)?
- 11. Why did Moses go alone to the mountain top (Ex. 24:12)?
