4. What was the law for mistreated slaves (Ex. 21:26–27)?
5. Was it murder to kill a thief caught in the act (Ex. 22:1–2)? What if he lived after being caught (Ex. 22:3–4)?
6. What was the sabbath law of the land and the people (Ex. 23:10–13)?
7. What three feasts did God establish (Ex. 23:11–16)?
8. What did God promise Israel? What condition did He place on this promise? (Ex. 23:20–33)?
9. What was the “book of the Covenant” (Ex. 24:1–7)? What did the people do upon hearing this book (Ex. 24:7–8)?
10. Who went part way up mount Sinai (Ex. 24:1, 9)? What did they see (Ex. 24:9–11)?
11. Why did Moses go alone to the mountain top (Ex. 24:12)?
12. How long was Moses on the mountain top (Ex. 24:17–18)?

6. What result was seen in Moses for having spoken with God (34:29–35)? What did Moses do about this?
7. Where did the items come from used in constructing all that God commanded (35:4–19)?
8. How did the attitude of the people change in chapter 33:7–11 and chapter 35 when compared with chapter 32?

8. A court was made outside the Tabernacle which surrounded the tabernacle. Using the definition of “cubit” determine the size of the court (38:9–20).
9. Define from Hebrew.

10. The High Priest’s garments were strictly designed by God.
 - A. Define “Ephod” (39:2).
 - B. How did they make gold thread (39:3)?
 - C. What was mounted on the square breastplate (39:8–21)?
 - D. List two details about his robe (39:22–26).
 - E. What was engraved on his crown (39:30)?

5. How old was Moses when Joshua is commissioned as the new leader (31:1–3)?
6. Why was Moses not allowed to enter Canaan (31:2)?
7. What was the promise of God upon their entering the land of Canaan (31:4–6)?
8. Why were the people to be strong and courageous (31:6)?
9. What command did Moses give to the priests (31:9–11)?
10. Why was this to be done every seven years (31:12–13)?

- What "bad report" did most of the spies give (13:30–33)?
- What was the result of this bad report (14:1–4)?
- Joshua and Caleb (the two faithful spies) urged the people to "not rebel against the Lord" (14:9). How were they rebelling?
- What was the response of the people to Joshua and Caleb (14:10)?
- What was God's attitude toward the nation of Israel after He had brought them safely to the promised land (14:11–12)?
- What caused God to change His mind (14:13–19)?
- What punishment did God still inflict on the Israelites (14:20–23, 27–35)?
- What was Caleb's "different spirit" which pleased God (14:24)?
- What happened to the unfaithful spies (14:36–38)?
- How did the Israelites further sin against God (14:39–45)?

Korah's Rebellion (Numbers 16–17)

- What complaint did Korah and others bring against Moses (16:1–3)?

- What complaint came to Moses?

- What was God's purpose in establishing a city of refuge (19:10)?
- What was God's law toward the one who intentionally murders (19:11–13)?
- How were the people to recognize the borders of their property (19:14)?
- Could a man be condemned on the testimony of one witness (19:15)?
- What was the punishment for the false witness who accused another (19:16–21)?

Obedience Urged (Deuteronomy 4:1–24; 8:1–20; 12:8–12)

- What language describes how God's law was permanent (4:1–2; 12:8–12)?
- What does Moses plead with the people for (4:6, 9, 15, 23)?
- What does Moses want the people to remember (4:10; 8:1–6, 11–14, 18–20)?

Teach Your Children (Deuteronomy 6:1–9; 11:18–21; 32:44–47)

- Why did the people need to obey the commands of God (6:1–3)?
- What does this mean: "the Lord is one" (6:4)?
- Compare 6:5 with Matthew 22:37–40. What should be our attitude toward God?
- Describe how the people were to teach their children (6:6–9; 11:18–21).
- What command were the people to give their sons (32:44–47)?
